Thank You, Newton Congregational UCC!

September 2016 seems like a really long time ago. That's when I started my internship experience at Congregational UCC, but the actual steps to make it a reality started in April 2016. I did not choose this location for my internship experience – it was recommended to me by my discernment pastor at Plymouth Congregational Church in Des Moines (Valerie Miller-Coleman). Valerie felt strongly that Reverend Jessica Petersen and THIS congregation would be a good fit for me and be an important step of my discernment process. Why? I did not know at the time, nor did I ask. But I can say that Valerie was absolutely correct in leading me here, and now I can begin to answer the 'why?' question.

I established goals for what I wanted to accomplish during this internship. I wanted to learn how to design and lead worship. I wanted to learn how to preach. I wanted to learn how the church operates behind the scenes and beyond Sunday worship. I wanted to learn about my own pastoral identity. This is what I came here to accomplish, and I think I am well on my way but I still have lots to learn.

Goals can never measure what I truly learned here. Entering into the internship, I expected to pursue a career in either social justice or to extend my church consulting practice. I thought I needed "real" church experience to support my career path so I wanted to work in a church for my internship. I was open to becoming a parish pastor, but I thought the chances were very slim.

I wasn't expecting to love the experience of being a pastor. I wasn't expecting to be so wowed by the generosity of spirit of this congregation. I wasn't expecting to be so accepted and made to feel like I truly was part of the church. The welcoming nature was beyond anything I had experienced at any church. Because of my experience at Newton Congregational UCC, I can see how church can be a healthy, loving and open place for everyone.

And, then there is Reverend Petersen. Jessica and I have spent hours and hours together discussing church, theology and congregational life. I have learned so much from her, and I am so grateful for the experience of working with Jessica which has contributed greatly to my pastoral formation. I truly believe that Jessica is a gift to this church. She is hard working, she is grounded in progressive theology, she is creative, she is smart, she cares so much and she loves her job.

Why was this church recommended to me? Now I know it was a combination of the church culture, the vitality of the congregation and the amazing pastor. When Valerie recommended this internship opportunity to me, she knew what I was getting into – I did not. Valerie knew I would grow in an internship experience here, and she was right!

What Valerie did not know was that this experience would lead me to a change in my heart and mind. Now, as I close out this internship, I expect that I will be called into a role of a pastor in a church when I graduate from the Iliff School of Theology in June of 2018. After being a church consultant and working with some very challenging church situations, I have the experience of Newton that has changed my heart about what a church can be and how important having a great pastor is.

Friends, it was YOU! It truly was you who welcomed me, guided me and provided a learning space for me to realize my call. I will never forget you, I will never forget the roll you played in my discernment and will never forget the impact this experience had on my life.

Food Pantry Sundays

The first Sunday of each month we receive donations for the Salvation Army Food Pantry. On Sunday, June 4th and Sunday, July 2nd a cart will be in the west entrance to receive gifts for the food pantry. The Salvation Army is in special need of tuna helper (not hamburger), Ramen noodles, canned fruit cocktail (peaches or pears), canned tuna, and macaroni & cheese. Of course, other canned or packaged foods are always accepted. They also need any kind of personal care items: such as diapers, bath soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, and laundry soap.



Jasper County Animal Rescue League

On the third Sunday of each month we collect items to help the Jasper County Animal Rescue League (JCARL). The next collection dates will be Sunday, June 18th and Sunday, July 16th.

Their current wish list is: paper towels, garbage bags, raw hides (for big dogs and small), peanut butter, bleach, dish soap, Fabuloso (the purple kind), laundry soap, liquid hand soap, rubber gloves, kitty litter, canned shredded and filet cat food, canned dog food (Purina), dry dog food (Purina), and dry cat food (Indoor Purina).



"Barking Good" Project

The Progress Industries partnership with UCC of making and baking dog treats in the church kitchen is in full swing. The project takes place on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of each month at 12:15pm. A new recipe is being used, but the dog treats remain all natural. Dozens of treats will be produced and shared with JCARL. Our church has helped PI move toward its target goal of getting out into the community setting which has provided a wonderful opportunity for all involved.

The dog treats produced not only make for happy dogs, but happy people too. So, to lend a hand, contact Stormy Storms. You'll have a very gratifying experience if you do.

Cleaning Project with Progress Industries

In addition to our partnership with Progress Industries (PI) to bake biscuits for the Jasper County Animal Rescue League, we also work with PI participants and staff for a church cleaning project. Under the guidance of Carolyn and Duane Hobbs a small group from PI is doing some light cleaning and dusting in the sanctuary, library and other areas of the church building. This cleaning project takes place two times per month, on Tuesdays at 10:30am.

Chapel Renovation Progress

Recipe Corner ...

Turkey Meatloaf with Feta and Sun-Dried Tomatoes



Ingredients

- Vegetable cooking spray
- 1/2 cup plain bread crumbs
- 1/3 cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
- 1/4 cup chopped garlic and herb-marinated sun-dried tomatoes
- 2 cloves garlic, minced, optional
- 2 eggs, at room temperature, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons whole milk
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- · 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 pound ground turkey, preferably dark meat

Directions

- 1. Place an oven rack in the center of the oven. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.
- 2. Spray a 9 by 5-inch loaf pan with cooking spray.
- 3. In a large bowl, stir together the bread crumbs, parsley, sun-dried tomatoes, garlic, if using, eggs, milk, feta, salt, and pepper. Add the turkey and gently stir to combine, being careful not to overwork the meat.
- 4. Carefully pack the meat mixture into the prepared pan and bake until the internal temperature registers 165 degrees F on an instant-read thermometer, about 45 minutes. Remove from the oven and let rest for 5 minutes. Transfer to a cutting board and slice. Put on a serving platter and serve.
