Pastor Petersen's Perspective: On Carla Cain

Last summer, I received a phone call asking if we here at Congregational UCC would be interested and willing to work with a seminary intern throughout the course of the 2016-2017 school year. As I had served in various internships during my seminary career, I was excited to have such an opportunity presented to us. The internships in which I had served during seminary were of great benefit to me in discerning my call to ministry as I came to better understand my particular gifts and growth areas for ministry. The Church Council approved, and it was with great joy that we welcomed Carla Cain, a student at Iliff School of Theology in Denver, Colorado, as she began her internship with us in September 2016.

Carla's service with us over the course of these past months has been a gift to me in a number of ways. Since I began my pastorate here back in September 2011, I have rarely had the opportunity to sit back and listen to another preach, to hear another's perspective on our sacred text, and to be challenged to go then and live. I have enjoyed being able to listen to Carla preach one Sunday each month, to observe her unique preaching style and see that style develop over time, and to engage in conversation with her about the text prior to the worship service. Carla's presence has provided me with the opportunity to worship in a different way than I have grown accustomed to over the past five and a half years, and for that I am thankful.

Throughout Carla's internship, as her supervisor, I have been tasked with helping her to develop her gifts for ministry and to better understand her call to serve. Much of this work has been around worship preparation and leadership, an area where she had little experience and a great desire to learn. As I have engaged in conversation with Carla regarding worship, I have had to think more deeply about my own process of worship planning and preaching as I explain to her my rational for choosing this particular scripture or structuring worship in this specific way. I have learned much about my own worship and sermon preparation process as I have sought to help Carla to develop her own style, and for this I am thankful.

Over the course of her internship, Carla and I have engaged in conversation around not only worship, but about all kinds of theological topics. We have discussed prayer; we have talked about the meaning of repentance; we have conversed about the church and God's call to work for justice. I have thoroughly enjoyed the theological conversations we have shared together as it isn't every day that such opportunities for discussion present themselves. Throughout Carla's time here, I have had someone right across the hall with whom to think through these interesting topics, and for that I am thankful.

During the past several months, I have seen Carla become a valuable part of this community of faith. I have witnessed her interact with you all during committee and Council meetings, on Sunday mornings before and after worship, and at other times during the week. I have seen relationships grow between you all and her. I have seen you offer her your support and constructive criticism as she engages in this learning process. I have heard Carla share her thoughts regarding how healthy she has experienced our congregation to be (and as a church consultant, she has experienced a lot of churches!). While Carla has been serving here with us, I have gained another perspective, a deeper understanding of who you are, who we are as a congregation, and for that I am thankful.

Carla's time with us here at Congregational UCC is now drawing to a close. Her final Sunday with us will be Sunday, May 21st. I strongly encourage you to come share in celebrating her months of service with us that Sunday as we send her off and wish her well as she continues on this journey of faith and in her ministry discernment.

It has been a gift for me to get to know and to work with Carla. Her presence will certainly be missed as she concludes her internship with us. I will continue to hold her in my thoughts and prayers as her journey continues and will be forever grateful for the time she has shared with us. I hope you will do the same.

The second portion of the series will take place on Sunday, May 7th at 9:00am and Monday, May 8th at 6:00pm. During this second session, we will view a TED Talk by Mia Birdsong entitled "The Story We Tell about Poverty Isn't True" and engage in discussion about this talk and "The Line."

You are encouraged to attend one meeting for each portion of the series. All gatherings will take place in the **Sanctuary** and last no longer than one hour. Food Pantry Sundays

The first Sunday of each month we receive donations for the Salvation Army Food Pantry. On **Sunday, May 7**th a cart will be in the west entrance to receive gifts for the food pantry. The Salvation Army is in special need of tuna helper, spaghetti (12-16 ounce packages or 1 pound packages), canned fruits, spaghetti sauce, and macaroni & cheese. Of course, other canned or packaged foods are always accepted. They also need any kind of personal care items: such as diapers, bath soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, and laundry soap.



"Barking Good" Project

The Progress Industries partnership with UCC of making and baking dog treats in the church kitchen has resumed again. They will be baking these all natural dog treats on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of each month at 12:15pm. Dozens of treats will be produced and shared with JCARL. Our church has helped PI move toward its target goal of getting out into the community setting which has provided a wonderful opportunity for all involved.

Jasper County Animal Rescue League

On the third Sunday of each month we collect items to help the Jasper County Animal Rescue League (JCARL). The next collection date will be **Sunday, May 21**st.

Their current wish list is: paper towels, garbage bags, raw hides (for big dogs and small), peanut butter, bleach, dish soap, Fabuloso (the purple kind), laundry soap, liquid hand soap, rubber gloves, kitty litter, canned shredded and filet cat food, canned dog food (Purina), dry dog food (Purina), and dry cat food (Indoor Purina).

Cleaning Project with Progress Industries

In addition to our partnership with Progress Industries (PI) to bake biscuits for the Jasper County Animal Rescue League, we also work with PI participants and staff for a church cleaning project. Under the guidance of Carolyn and Duane Hobbs a small group from PI is doing some light cleaning and dusting in the sanctuary, library and other areas of the church building. This cleaning project takes place two times per month, on Tuesdays at 10:30am.

SHARE Iowa

Self Help and Resource Exchange (SHARE) is back in Newton as our Newton Area Ministerial Association began offering this program through our churches in April. SHARE brings people together to build and strengthen community through volunteer service by providing access to good, nutritious food at affordable prices. Through SHARE, members of the community (there are no age, income, or membership requirements to participate; though participants are encouraged to volunteer with SHARE or elsewhere in the community) will have an opportunity to sign up for a food box for up to 50% off supermarket prices. Items available vary each month and include meats, grocery items, fresh fruits and vegetables, and even desserts. The May menu can be found on the reverse side of this page (p. #6).

Petersen, our local host organization, First United Methodist Church (641.792.4648, ask for Pastor Gary), or online (www.shareiowa.org) and must be received by Thursday, May 4th. Payment is required when you place your order; you may pay by cash, check (made out to: First Christian Church), EBT, or online using Pay Pal. The May delivery/pick-up day will be on Saturday, May 20th, 7:30am-8:30am at First United Methodist Church.

You are also welcome to drop in to meet the volunteer coordinators on a distribution day and see what SHARE is all about. Scalloped Tomatoes



Ingredients

- Olive oil
- 2 cups (1/2-inch diced) bread from a French boule, crusts removed
- 16 plum tomatoes, cut 1/2-inch dice (about 2 1/2 pounds)
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic (3 cloves)
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup julienned basil leaves, lightly packed
- 1 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Heat 3 tablespoons of olive oil in a large (12 inch) sauté pan over medium heat. Add the bread cubes and stir to coat with the oil. Cook over medium to medium-high heat for 5 minutes, stirring often, until the cubes are evenly browned.
- 3. Meanwhile, combine the tomatoes, garlic, sugar, salt, and pepper in a large bowl. When the bread cubes are done, add the tomato mixture and continue to cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes. Off the heat, stir in the basil.
- 4. Pour the tomato mixture into a shallow (6 to 8 cup) baking dish. Sprinkle evenly with the Parmesan cheese and drizzle with 2 tablespoons of olive oil.
- 5. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes until the top is browned and the tomatoes are bubbly. Serve hot or warm.
