because they are cut off from what they need and hold them in our hearts.

One: Show us, O God who sees, how to reach out and build bridges

to promote the healing of our broken relationships.

All: Open our ears, O God who hears,

that we may hear the cries of those who are ailing

and respond with compassionate action

creating boundless, borderless communities of care.

May it be so! Amen.
